
Huntsville AEE's Mission

- Introduce student engineers to the Energy field.




History – Huntsville Chapter

 - Energy Project of 2011 Steve Cotney




Recent Activities

- Monthly meeting presentations are added to website for download.





Four Officers and seven Committee Chairmen meet to plan Chapter programs and events and discuss ways to grow membership.









What: Certified Energy Manager (CEM®) Training and Exam.


- Sponsorships to vendors wanting to showcase their product(s) during lunch.
